


## Children of the Civil War

**J**ohnny Clem fought in the famous battle of Chickamauga. He was 12 years old. Escaped slave, "**Contraband**" Jackson, served as a drummer boy and stretcher-bearer. Fifteen year old **Tillie Pierce** served as a nurse at Gettysburg. They were just three of the thousands of boys and girls engaged in the Civil War; whether on the front lines or back at the home, active in vital adult roles that would astonish us today.

Civil war historian and reenactor, **Yvonne Bigney**, promises to bring the subject alive on April 27th. If you saw her presentation on **Civil War Women** last year at the Center, you know her presentation is bound to be engaging, as well as educational.
