

**Descendants of William Mapes**

*Generation One*

Minisink). His mother was Sally M., daughter of Colonel Nathaniel Wheeler, of Mount Eve, (Town of Warwick) Orange County, – an extensive land owner and one of the most prominent men of the locality. Christopher Van Duzer of Warwick, who was a captain in the Revolutionary War, was his grandfather.

In June, 1824, he moved with his father into Chemung County, then Tioga, and settled upon the Ridge Road, in the town of Veteran, on what has long been known as the Van Duzer farm. When he first settled in Veteran, there were only about ten acres cleared land upon the farm and only one or two frame houses between it and Horseheads. From 1838-1843, he was engaged in the lumber business in the town of Southport, first with Sylvester Sexton, and afterwards with Colonel Eli Wheeler, and erected a steam saw mill upon his timber tract, supposed to have been the second steam saw mill within the limits of Chemung county. This enterprise was unsuccessful and he returned to the farm and remained there until 1872, when his health compelled him to relinquish his active business, and he moved to the village of Horseheads, where he died August 5, 1876.

He married Louisa Turner, the eldest daughter of Harvey Turner, Dec. 31, 1840, who with two sons survive him.

He served actively for thirty years for several terms as assessor, and for many years was postmaster of the Vétéran post office, established by his father soon after moving into this county. In the days of stage coaches the post office was quite an important centre for the country around it. In 1850 he was elected superintendent of the Poor for Chemung County on the Democratic ticket and served three years. Being a Free-Soil Democrat, he early joined the Republican party and ran in 1856 for the position of sheriff unsuccessfully. After the passage of the act in 1857, creating a board of commissioners of excise, he was appointed by Judge North in May 1857, one of the Excise Commissioners for Chemung County and served until 1861, when his term expired. When the war of the Rebellion broke out, though exempt from military duty, at his own expense sent a man into the army.

**Note:** some events in this chart took place in Wallkill, Orange Co. NY. This refers to the Town of Wallkill, in Orange County. When the record indicates Wallkill, Ulster County, it refers to the hamlet of Wallkill in Ulster County NY. When reference is made to Wallkill NY, we can only guess whether it refers to the Orange County or Ulster County place. Wallkill Cemetery refers to a cemetery located in the hamlet of Phillipsburgh, in the Town of Wallkill in Orange County NY.
